1. The parking lot poles are WHITE! We appreciate John Lucas for this surprise and for keeping the bushes so nicely trim.

- 2. Should we burn the sand? Volunteers with torches? We should burn off the weeds and rake them up afterwards. We formed a committee of Jonathan Standridge, Brice Lenz and Dave Rankin to tackle the problem. Brice will head up the effort. Tina has offered her flame thrower.
- 3. New Weed-eater is a beast! And it is balanced so well that the delicate queen can use it. However, as there are a lot of weeds, another battery may be required.
- 4. The lawn mower may need a new blade. Dave Rankin offered to sharpen the current one. Jonathan will remove the blade and get it to Dave.
- 5. A new sign has been installed on the fence for us to list when we are having group gatherings on the beach lot. Please list your large group gathering there so that your neighbors can decide when to have their parties. The Beach Lot remains open to all when there are large groups there, the list is for the neighborhood to know when that is happening.
- 6. The parking lot light is out. Dave Rankin said he would fix it. Thanks Dave.
- 7. Diving Platform Replacement: Jonathan Standridge
  - 1. Jonathan, Bob, Dave and Rotem have been studying neighborhood docks to see what we can learn. They think we have the know how in the neighborhood to build our own platform, similar to the ones we helped the Shore Club build to launch their fireworks a few years ago.
  - 2. There will be a composite top and polyurethane floats. This will eliminate the Styrofoam presently under the dock. This combination looks good, it's easy to repair and comes with a 10 year warranty. The size of the new platform will be 16' by 12', larger than our current platform. The surface is not slippery, it is perforated so that water won't pool on it, and ducks and geese hate it!! YAY! Cheers from swimmers everywhere!
  - 3. It is estimated that it could be built over one long weekend with neighborhood volunteer labor. The estimate for materials and delivery is \$9000.
  - 4. We have \$3245 in donations so far from 18 individuals. To raise funds we had suggestions of a Beach Lot Garage Sale around Labor Day, a raffle, a bake sale and a call for donations for those who use and love our Beach Lot. It was also suggested that we ask for donations at our 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade and sing along.
- 8. Thanks to Deb and Tony Anderson for always putting out the garbage cans for pick up.
