Treasurer's Report: Bob Simmons

The Gazebo numbers are:

The Paddle-board and Kayak Rack project received \$370 in donations and \$267 has been spent so far. More information below.

Our 4th of July Parade Permit is running around \$222. This is to cover the city workers needed to put up barriers and the insurance requirement.

Lake Monitor Report: Alden Chace

Alden reports that there are invasive iris growing along the shoreline. “We had the kayak out to go along the lake shore and noted a lot of the Yellow Flag Iris in bloom on the beaches. My vote is that we should make an effort to remove it from our beaches as it is a noxious non-native plant which spreads aggressively.”

In researching removal, we should pull them out by the roots – or tubers that form below the sand.

Beach Lot:

Some awesome volunteers – Terry Baccus and Dave Rankin cleaned off the dock and put up string to keep the ducks and geese off the dock! So great to see it clean! Terry then removed it recently so kids could jump off without getting tripped up.

Jonathan Standridge and Tony Anderson got the Paddleboard and Kayak Rack installed behind the restrooms. Depending on usage, there is

space to add another rack. There will be a sign up sheet and register to store your paddle-board or kayak at the Beach Lot. You will need to bring your own locking device. Currently there are 4 slots. How to fairly share this convenience will be discussed at future meetings.
